



The Materials Recovery for the Future (MRFF) research program is looking to partner with a U.S. materials recovery facility (MRF) and the community(s) it serves to pilot curbside recycling of flexible packaging. MRFF is offering technical assistance and financial assistance to help upgrade the MRF that participates in the pilot.

The criteria for the partner community(s) and MRF are:

1. Community is interested in recycling more materials,
2. Community has policy and fee structure in place to facilitate adding materials for recycling,
3. Community needs more diversion to meet zero waste or recycling goals,
4. MRF has processing throughput minimum of 20 tons per hour,
5. MRF is single stream (no dual stream, fiber only or MWPF),
6. The economics are more attractive in high landfill tip fee markets, and
7. End markets are potentially available (fuel or mechanical recycling)
